Prof. George Menachery, was one of the very first to study, research, propagate, and introduce many aspects of the history of India and its peoples through his forays into the fields of Archaeology, Anthropology, Place Name Studies, Numismatics, and Epigraphy through the many organisations he founded for the study of history. His long association with many national and international history-related organisations and bodies and his connection with the Church History Association of India, especially as the convener of the organizing committee for the 6th Triennial, Alwaye 1985, as its vice-chairman (elected at the 13th Triennial, Goa, 2005), and at present as its Secretary General (elected at the 14th Triennial, Shillong, 2008), and as the vice-chairman of the International Christian Studies wing of the Institute of Asian Studies (Chennai), as member of the Advisory Board of Archaeology (Govt. of Kerala 1975-82), Executive Committee member (and Chief Editor of the Malayalam Literary Survey) of the Kerala Sahitya Academy, Member of the Governing Body of the Christian Chair of the Calicut University, Vice President of the Newman Association of India (Bombay 1964-1972), Executive Committee member of the Census of India Publications wing (Kerala), President of Kalasadan (1985 - 1992), Visiting Professor of Christian Art at the Pontifical Institute, Alwaye (1984 to the present) and as a Visiting Professor at the DVK, Bangalore) and at other seminaries inside and outside Kerala, office-bearer and life member of the Kerala History Association, sometime vice-chairman of the Kerala History Congress, Founder Director of the Leadership Training Institute (from 1967 to the present), founder president of the Kerala historical research society, HOD and P. G. Professor of English, Member of the Senate and the Statutory Finance Committee of the Calicut University &c. helped bring to the field of historical study and research a new enthusiasm and a new vigour. The St. Thomas Christian Encyclopaedia of India (1973, 1982, 2009), The Thomapedia (2000), Indian Church History Classics Vol. I "The Nazranies" (1998), Die Wunderbare Geschichte der Nazranee oder Malabar Christen von heiligen Thomas, (in German), (1994), Kodungallur the City of St. Thomas (1987), Glimpses of Nazraney Heritage (2005), are his more famous works. He has set up many historical and cultural museums and organized many exhibitions in India and abroad. The Mar Thoma Puraskaram, Darsana Award, History Congress Award, Alenchery History Award, the KCBC Daarsanika Vijnanika Award, P. Thomas Foundation Award, and above all the first ever award instituted by the Syro-Malabar Church were some of the awards conferred on him. Pope Benedict XVI made him a Chevalier by conferring on him the Membership of the Equestrian Order of St. Gregory the Great, KSG.
